### Wendy Hall (Cliffmere)

My first breed Beagle's, was bought for me by my husband in 1966, I also attended my first Crufts in that year as a spectator and was smitten. Over the last 52 years, we have always owned and shown Beagles, making up Champion in the Breed. We were Beagle Welfare Officers for 30 years my husband was Chairman of the Beagle Association for 20 years and is currently the President. 35 years ago, we added Miniature Long Haired Dachshunds to our kennels, which we have bred and shown with Success, we were the first Dachshund breeders to breed the top Stud dog in the Hound group and 5th over all breeds, this had never been achieved by any variety of Dachshund before. I am currently Chairman of Eastern Counties Dachshund Association. We have made up champions in both our breeds and judge Beagles and the six varieties of Dachshunds at Championship show level. My husband Doug and I have judged our breeds all over the world including South Africa, Japan, Australia and Europe. I am really looking forward to judging the Fauves at your club show and can't wait to meet you and your hounds.

**Ceri McEwan (Marunnel)**

I have been attending championship dog shows and have had an interest in dogs for over 20 years, predominantly attending on pastoral day. I spent 2 years researching breeds that would fit into our lifestyle and, despite being warned 'don't get a hound, they're hard to train', we settled on Petit Basset Griffon Vendéen. Our first dog joined us in 2008 and I have been actively showing the breed ever since. I also competed in obedience shows with my first PBGV, obtaining a fourth place in a large class. Soon after we obtained our second PBGV and was able to make him up to a Champion in 2013. Our first PBGV bitch (also made up to a Champion) followed a couple of years later. Our first Fauve came about through a chance conversation expressing an interest in the breed and he later produced his first litter in 2017, the puppies of whom can often be seen in the ring. We bred our first litter of PBGV in 2017 and continue to show 3 puppies from this litter. We now have a total of 6 PBGVs and 2 Fauves which all live happily (for the most part) as a single pack. I first judged PBGV in 2015 and I am now on the B list for PBGV and GBGV and the C list for Fauves.

◆ **Special Awards** ◆

As a Club we feel it is important to encourage new judges of our breed. Therefore, we have decided to offer 'Special Awards' classes at our annual Open Show. We very much hope exhibitors will support this initiative and provide a good entry for our Special Awards classes judge.

Entry fee for the 'Special Awards' classes is £2:00 per dog per class (members / non-members).

There will not be a Best 'Special Awards' award.

**N.B. These Special Awards are judged as an entirely separate entity from the 'Open Show'**

**IF YOUR DOG IS BEATEN IN THE 'SPECIAL AWARDS' IT IS NOT CLASSED AS A BEATEN DOG AND IS NOT DISQUALIFIED FROM CHALLENGING IN THE OPEN SHOW.**



## Fauve Parade

All Fauves are welcome at the club's 2019 Open Show including veterans, rescues & family pets.

A parade of Fauves for those not entered in the open show or special awards classes will be held with a prize for each Fauve participating.

Fauves participating in the parade can attend the show for free. This can be done in advance by using the standard entry form, please mark the class as "P" for Parade only. Alternatively, this can be done on the day (owners must complete a Spectator Dog form on arrival by speaking with the Show Manager or Secretary).

*Thinking about showing your Fauve but not sure what to do?  
Please come along to the Open Show to speak with Fauve owners, exhibitors, breeders and judges for more information and guidance.*

*Not sure who to speak with on the day? Ask for the Show Manager or Secretary and they will be pleased to assist you.*

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 10.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 12.30 p.m. for Special Awards and not before 1.00 p.m. for the Open Show
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The entry fees will be  
Members - £4.00 first class per dog, each subsequent entry with same dog £1.00.  
Non-members - £5.00 first class per dog, each subsequent entry with same dog £1.00p.  
Brace class £1.00 per entry. Not for competition - 50p per dog. Junior Handling - £1.00,  
Special Awards classes £2.00 per entry
6. The amount of prize money on offer at this show is for Special Awards Classes only 1st £5, 2nd £3, 3rd £2,
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show  
Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
11. Best in Show  
Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS**  
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered or Not for Competition:
18. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

### **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days**

**Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.**

**Please take care of your dog.**

**If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.**

## **DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES**

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. 21st February 2019

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) Transfer

(a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height..

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Junior: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Novice: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Post Graduate: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

Limit For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won three or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Open: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

Veteran: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show

Brace For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) belonging to the same exhibitor, each having been entered in some class other than Brace

Champion For dogs that have achieved their Show Champion title

K.C. Good Citizen For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above

Neutered Dog/Bitch Confined to dogs and bitches who have been neutered and permission to show has been granted by the Kennel Club.

## **Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
  - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2.
  - a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
  - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
  - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
