◆ YOUR JUDGE ◆


Liz Thornton (Mochras)

Thank you for this invitation to judge the Open show of the BFDB Club, I am looking forward to it and thank everyone who will go to the effort of bringing hounds to be looked over.

I have owned and shown dogs since acquiring my first Irish Wolfhound as a girl, in 1970. I first gave CCs some time around the mid 1980s and never sought to judge any other breed for many more years. I first became aware of the Basset Fauve de Bretagne when, with my then husband and Roger and Debbie Tebbutt, we hired a two engined plane and flew over to Dinan for the weekend to look at the breed at the Elevage, which must have been around 1990. Patrick loved to fly, Roger wanted to photograph Mont St Michel from the air, and Debbie and I spent a not inconsiderable time eating and drinking very well indeed and sleeping on La Plage the next day. Sadly my memories of the Fauves are not supported by any photographs. My main memories are of the display of Norman country dancing and the way in which the dogs were shown, on lengths of baler twine while being discussed by two or three breed experts at a time while les Anglais desperately tried to figure out what was going on. Soon afterwards the Tebbutts acquired Jacques from one of the first UK litters. Very typical of his breed in that he free-ranged around their farm and didn't much respond to anyone calling his name! We were in Anglesey when Pat Crawshaw (Ceffni) had a nice litter, again not tempted. A decade or so later on it was Bruce who thought it looked a nice little breed to add to the household for their usual role as ear cleaner to Irish Wolfhounds. Clementine fulfilled her vocation very well indeed and fifteen years later is still with us, while the Wolfhounds have died out.

We now have several generations of BFDB under the "Mochrashounds" appellation, always living in the house enjoying the best life I can give them. Some are UK and/or Irish Champions (we like our Irish summer holidays, Bruce can play golf and I can play dog shows). Although we cannot hunt with hounds in the UK my background included a mis spent youth lamping for foxes and deer with my brother and his friends, hare coursing with Wolfhounds, following Bloodhounds when they had trials on the estate near our then home and (pre and post ban) owning many excellent lure coursing Wolfhounds, Larkspur and Erin being the top stakes winners. My two imported BFDB were from hunting kennels in France. It has been extremely interesting, picking the owners brains for how these little hounds hunt and which features most make them "fit for function" in the opinion of those who know they are expected to cover 13 kilometres or so during a hunt.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(N.B. The word 'dog' includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday, 22nd February 2020.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

KC GOOD CITIZEN DOG SCHEME For dogs that have achieved their GCDS Bronze Award Certificate or above.

SPECIAL NEUTERED For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show. Confined to neutered dogs or bitches.

EVANS ROBERTS OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

CHAMPION For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion or Show Champion under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

RULES and REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time after the opening of the show but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
3. Judging of special award classes will commence not before 1.00 pm. Open show judging not before 1.30 pm.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **Entry Fees: Non-Members:** First Entry per dog £5.00; each subsequent entry with the same dog £1.00. **Members:** First entry per dog £4.00; each subsequent entry with the same dog £1.00. **Special Award Classes:** £2.00 per entry. **Brace:** £1.00 per entry. **Not for Competition:** £1.00 per dog (**see Rule 18**). **Catalogues:** £2.00 pre-paid with entries. **Membership:** UK £8.00 Single; £10.00 Joint; Overseas £10.00 Single; £12.00 Joint.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **Best in Show:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11..
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BEAT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

DOG FOULING & GROOMING WASTE

Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.

The Chalking, powdering or spraying (with the exceptions of water) of exhibits within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

DIRECTIONS TO OVERSEAL VILLAGE HALL DE12 6LU

Overseal is situated on the A444 between Burton Upon Trent and the M42/A42

There are signs for the village hall from both directions.

From Burton Upon Trent: it is approximately 5 miles to Overseal. At the crossroads flanked by a church and a pub, turn left on to the B5004 (Woodville Road).

From the M42/A42 (Junction 11): it is approximately 3 miles to Overseal. At the crossroads flanked by a church and a pub, turn right on to the B5004 (Woodville Road).

The village hall is after a short distance on the right.
