



## General Health Survey 2020 Report

The survey was issued by post and email to the full membership of the UK breed club representing 125 households. In addition, the survey was published and publicised on the club's website and Facebook account and advertised via the Kennel Club Journal to try to reach the widest possible audience, including non-members of the breed club.

33 responses were received, reports totalling 80 dogs with 61 living Fauves.

37 (60.6%) dogs with health conditions within an age range of birth to 13 years 6 months.

29 (78.3%) dogs having 1 condition; 4 (10.8%) dogs having 2 conditions; 3 (8.1%) dogs having 3 conditions and 1 (2.7%) dog having 4 conditions.

24 (39.3%) Fauves within an age range of 1 year to 12 years and 3 months were reported to have no health concerns.
